Taking Root: Walking Wet...Water of Promise — Week of March 1, 2009

Monday, March 2

A Time of Preparation

The Lenten Season, the weeks preceding Easter, is a time for reflection and meditation on the wonder of God's love made manifest in Jesus' atoning sacrifice on the Cross and glorious resurrection on Easter. In the early church (and in some churches today), Lent was a time of instruction and spiritual nurturing for those who would be baptized during the Easter vigil. Consider your own baptism; do you see it as a testimony to God's grace or as a work you must do to be saved? If it is a gift of grace, how do you/we receive it? Read Matthew 28:18-20; John 1:12-13, 29-34; and Acts 2:37-42. This Lent, pray you will learn to more fully live in your baptismal covenant.

Tuesday, March 3

Covenants

A covenant is a sacred promise or pledge; the theme of covenant weaves like a golden thread through Scripture. Our week's texts recall one of God's covenants; read Genesis 9:8-17 and 1 Peter 3:18-22. God takes the initiative in Scriptural covenants; some require God's people to respond; some are unilateral. Can you recall other Biblical covenants? The New Testament is also called the New Covenant; ponder this. Read Genesis 15:1-21; 17:1-13; Deuteronomy 30:6; Jeremiah 31:31-34; and Matthew 26:26-30. Is there a relationship between circumcision (*Genesis 17*) and baptism? How does each relate to the covenant community? Read 2 Corinthians 1:20 and pray.

Wednesday, March 4

Sign of the Covenant

Read Genesis 9:8-17; mark every reference to covenant. This covenant, established between God and all creation, is everlasting. What is its sign? The waters that brought judgment on sin also brought those on the ark to safety. Now read 1 Peter 3:18-22; the text is difficult. Pray for insight into Peter's analogies. Peter mentions "the pledge of a good conscience toward God" (*3:21, NIV*); what was Noah's "pledge of a good conscience"? Was it trust in God's word? At the risk of stretching an analogy, consider that as we are "saved through water" (*baptism—3:20-21*), Jesus is our ark, the One who saves us. What is the covenant sign (*Ephesians 1:13-14*)? Pray with gratitude.

Thursday, March 5

Baptism: Gift and Grace

Our human tendency is to try to earn our salvation one way or another. Ponder the abundance of God's gifts and grace. Can we earn these? Even faith is a gift of God's grace (*Mark 9:24; John 6:44; 17:25-26a; 1 Timothy 1:14; Hebrews 12:2*), and this is a divine mystery. Hear God's heart as you read Luke 15:20; 19:10; John 3:16-17; 6:37; 1 Timothy 2:4; Titus 2:11; and 2 Peter 3:9. Baptism is a command (*Matthew 28:18-20; Acts 2:38*), but it's a command established in grace; being baptized is running into or resting in Jesus' love; it's receiving the gift he purchased with his blood. Pray Toplady's lyrics: "Nothing in my hand I bring, simply to thy Cross I cling."

Friday, March 6

Let's Open the Gifts

Many receive God's gifts but neglect to open them; it's like putting aside a wrapped package. Grace, baptism, forgiveness, salvation, the gifts and fruit of the Spirit, and so much more are part of our inheritance as God's beloved children. Do we walk in our baptismal covenant; repent and seek forgiveness and renewal daily; and allow the Spirit to work in and through us; or do we claim but then ignore God's priceless gifts, leaving them "on the shelf"? Read Romans 6:1-11; Galatians 3:26-29; Colossians 2:9-14; and Titus 3:4-8. What are these epistle writers telling us about our life in Christ? Talk to the Lord about "unwrapping" what it means to belong to Jesus.

Saturday, March 7

Make Disciples

Jesus doesn't tell us simply to baptize; he says, "*Go, make disciples.*" Do you see yourself as a disciple of Jesus; if so, do you invite others into relationship with Jesus and encourage them in their faith journeys? Read Matthew 28:18-20. Did you notice Jesus' words about baptizing, teaching, and obeying? What do the following texts teach about being a disciple and/or making disciples: Deuteronomy 6:4-9; John 13:34-35; 14:15; Ephesians 4:11-13; and Hebrews 10:14-25; 13:20-21? Talk to Jesus about growing as a disciple and about making disciples.

Sunday, March 8

Walking Wet

Read Matthew 5:17-18; Romans 10:4; 1 Corinthians 15:1-6; 2 Corinthians 1:20; Titus 3:4-8a; and 1 Peter 1:23-25; 2:9-10, considering how each reflects back to thoughts about Covenant and God's initiative in reaching out to us with mercy and love. Did you notice that the promises are rooted in Jesus' death and resurrection? "Walking wet" refers to how we live daily in light of our baptism, in light of God's grace. Ponder this and pray as you read Colossians 2:6-15; 3:1-4, 12-17. Three times in Colossians 3:15-17, Paul tells us to be thankful. Offer thanks!
